BIG DATA IN VACCINOLOGY: Delivering on its Promise

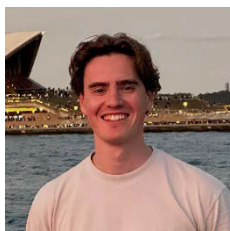
For this event, we will have 5 distinguished keynote speakers, in addition to several early-career speakers who will be selected from submitted abstracts.

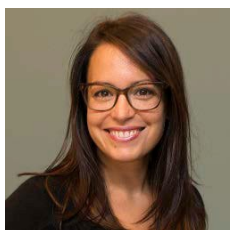

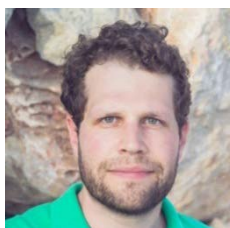
